Memorandum of Understanding

Milford Senior High School

WHEREAS, this is a Memorandum of Understanding between the Milford Education Association, DSEA/NEA and the Milford School District Board of Education regarding a temporary modification of the daily work schedule as outlined in article XV section 15.2.1 of the Agreement between the Milford School District Board of Education and the Milford Education Association, DSEA/NEA, Teachers Negotiated Agreement 2021-2023. This agreement is in effect for the 2022-2023 school year.

THEREFORE, the MEA and District do hereby agree to the following:

Administration may utilize up to twenty (20) minutes of one (1) planning period per week on a rotating basis to provide coverage in classrooms. Administration will evaluate all available options in making best attempts to limit the twenty (20) minutes of coverage to one (1) planning period per week and four (4) times per month. Equity of coverage, within a class period, shall be kept consistent on a monthly basis. This may result in a loss of consecutive planning time; however, each coverage person should still receive their forty-five (45) minutes of planning time.

On Mondays with a homeroom, teachers who have planning on periods one (1) through three (3), and who are scheduled for coverage, will receive two (2) coverage credits due to the loss of forty-five (45) minutes of planning.

With the exception of emergency or illness, teachers will be given twenty-four (24) hours' notice of coverage. With the exception of emergency or illness, TAM partners will not be called out of scheduled classes.

If a coverage person does not show and a teacher loses an additional twenty (20) minutes of planning, the coverage credit will be taken from the missing teacher and applied to the other. All efforts will be made to minimize this. Teachers should call student services and/or the main office immediately if coverage does not show after their assigned twenty (20) minutes.

Loss of 45 minutes or more of planning due to attending an IEP meeting(s) will result in one coverage credit.

Administration will create, and share with the faculty, a spreadsheet to ensure that coverage is spread equally through all available faculty members, which will be filled out and maintained by the staff responsible for assigning coverage. The MEA may request a meeting with administration to review the implementation at any time. Administration will make all attempts to ensure that all coverage is documented with fidelity.

Inclement Weather Contingency Plan for Remote Learning Milford School District 2022-2023 School Year

Purpose: There may be times during the school year that Milford School District must close due to inclement weather. So that our school-community is best prepared for the possibility of remote learning days, the following plan will guide our remote learning decision-making when school is closed due to inclement weather:

1-Day School Closure for Students Due to Inclement Weather Event: No Remote Learning for Students *If there is an adverse weather forecast prior, will have students take technology home prior to the weather event*

Multiple-Day School Closure for Students Due to Inclement Weather Event:

- Day 1 No Remote Learning for Students
- Day 2 Remote Learning for Students unless the severity of the inclement weather event interferes with the capability of having a remote learning day
- Days 3 and Beyond Same as Day 2

If there is an adverse weather forecast prior, will have students take technology home prior to the weather event

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



Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) Compliance

Milford School District adopts the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA):

- 1. **Internet safety policy:** Schools shall abide by the Delaware Department of Technology and Information's (DTI) technology protection measures or filters to monitor online activities of minors to monitor the following:
 - Access by minors to inappropriate matter on the internet or World Wide Web;
 - Safety and security of minors when using electronic mail, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic communications;
 - Unauthorized access including "hacking" and other unlawful activities by minors online;
 - Unauthorized disclosure, use, dissemination of personal information regarding minors; and
 - Measures designed to restrict minors' access to materials harmful to minors.

"Minor" is defined as any individual who has not attained the age of 17 years.

- Technology protection measure: Schools shall utilize DTI's technology protection to block or filter internet access on all of computers with internet access against access by adults and minors to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography, or – with respect to the use of computers with internet access by minors – harmful to minors.
- 3. **Education:** Schools shall educate minors about appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking websites and in chat rooms, cyberbullying awareness, and response.

SALARY SCHEDULE – SUBSTITUTES

Persons employed as substitutes shall be paid as follows:

- <u>Teachers</u> Substitute teachers will be compensated in accordance with the individual's classification as a Class A, Class B, or Class C substitute on the salary scale found in 14 <u>Delaware Code</u>, Chapter 13, Section 1326. Substitute teachers serving in a long-term capacity shall receive, at a minimum, an increase of 1.35 times their Class (A, B or C) rate after 10 consecutive days of service in the same teaching assignment, or as otherwise approved by district office administration.
- 2. <u>Paraprofessionals</u> Substitute paraprofessionals will be compensated in accordance with the Class C Substitute rate found in 14 <u>Delaware Code</u>, Chapter 13, Section 1326. Milford School District may approve a paraprofessional substitute serving in a critical needs capacity to be compensated at the substitute teacher rate for which they qualify. Class C substitute paraprofessionals serving in a long-term capacity shall receive, at a minimum, an increase of 1.35 times their Class C rate after 10 consecutive days of service in the same assignment, or as otherwise approved by district office administration.
- <u>Custodian</u> Substitute custodians will be compensated in accordance with the hourly rate calculated at 0 years' experience for salary scales found in 14 <u>Delaware Code</u>, Chapter 13, Section 1311, Custodian and the local Custodial/Maintenance Negotiated Agreement. (The annual salary shall be divided by 261 days and then further divided by 8 hours.)
- 4. <u>Child Nutrition</u> Substitute child nutrition workers will be compensated in accordance with the hourly rate identified at 0 years' experience.
- 5. <u>Secretaries</u> Substitute secretaries will be compensated in accordance with the hourly rate calculated at 0 years' experience for salary scales found in 14 <u>Delaware Code</u>, Chapter 13, Section 1308, Senior Secretary and the local Secretary Negotiated Agreement. (The annual salary shall be divided by 261 days and then further divided by 7.5 hours) Hourly rate is used for personnel working less than a full workday.
- 6. <u>School Nurse</u> Substitute nurses will be compensated \$200.00 per day.




National School Bus Safety Week
